Dear Members of St. George's Parish,

This is Susan, again. I am enclosing this letter from Development and Peace — Caritas Canada. If you could take a few minutes to <u>read it</u>, and prayerfully consider <u>signing the petition</u>, and maybe, becoming a <u>member of Development and Peace</u>, you'd be <u>helping to make a</u> <u>difference in the lives of those less fortunate than us.</u>

Headlines in the past year show a world in crisis. In Madagascar, villages are transforming to become ecologically sustainable and self-reliant. All of these efforts are empowered by our partners in those countries with direct support from Development and Peace. And from Canadians like you!

Our partners tell us that, sadly, the investments and activities of Canadian companies often bring major ecological destruction and violence to their communities.
