Easter Sunday: The Resurrection of the Lord

Acts 10:34a, 37–43 / Col 3:1–4 or 1 Cor 5:6b–8 / Jn 20:1–9 or Mt 28:1–10 Afternoon or evening: Lk 24:13–35

The spring after I bought my first home, my mother and I spent an evening exploring the extensive garden, identifying budding flowers and plants. We discovered a large stone hidden among the leaves of several yucca plants. I wanted to move the stone to a more prominent place, but after one failed attempt to lift the heavy boulder I declared, "That thing isn't moving!" My 71-year-old mother, persistently stubborn, said, "That's ridiculous," and she bent down and lifted the stone herself. I could have fallen over and hit my head on the stone in shock. She was stronger than I was in that moment, stronger than I had imagined she could be.

An even larger and heavier stone rested in front of Jesus' tomb. In Jesus' day, it was common for heavy boulders to be placed in front of tombs to keep out animals and grave robbers. You can imagine the shock of Jesus' followers when they discovered the stone rolled away from the tomb. That was no light stone! Something profound had taken place for it to be moved....something we now know as the resurrection—the miracle of Jesus' triumph over death.

Though we might be hesitant to acknowledge them, we all have heavy stones covering the tombs in our lives. But instead of keeping out intruders, they keep in failures, dead dreams, and unhealed hurts. We may have given up hope and declared about our stones, "That thing isn't moving!" Yet because of Easter, Jesus says to us, "That's ridiculous"—and lifts, rolls, shoves, and explodes our tombstones away.

Jesus' resurrection not only brought us eternal life, but also brings us new life from the tombs of everyday life. He is stronger than we are—stronger even than we've imagined him to be.

April 24, 2011 Why is the Sabbath on Sunday?

Why did the Christian Church change the sabbath from the seventh day of the week to the first?

Dear Rose,

Law found in the Old Testament (including the Ten Commandments) is known to Christians as the Old Law. The Old Law was revealed to the Israelites and, as given, was binding only on them. Jesus came "not to abolish but to fulfill" the Old Law (Matthew 5:17) and establish the New Law.

The Old Law commandment to observe the sabbath is a good example of this. We are bound to observe a day of rest and worship, but we are not bound to do it on Saturday.

But why Sunday? According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, it's because "Jesus rose from the dead 'on the first day of the week.' Because it is the 'first day,' the day of Christ's Resurrection recalls the first creation. Because it is the 'eighth day' following the sabbath, it symbolizes the new creation ushered in by Christ's Resurrection. For Christians it has become the first of all days, the first of all feasts, the Lord's Day...Sunday" (2174).

The Catechism goes on to say that Sunday Mass "fulfills the moral command of the Old Covenant, taking up its rhythm and spirit in the weekly celebration of the Creator and Redeemer of his people" (2176).

When should babies be baptized?

My daughter had a baby on January 3, but she's not planning to have him baptized until May to coincide with a visit from her in-laws. Is it OK to wait that long?

Dear Regina,

The Catholic Church's Code of Canon Law says, "Parents are obliged to take care that infants are baptized in the first few weeks; as soon as possible after the birth or even before it, they are to...request the sacrament for their child and to be prepared properly for it" (867).

Funny, we would never be careless about a birth certificate, which establishes citizenship on Earth. We don't delay what is important to us. Yet we can be so careless about citizenship in the City of God, which baptism establishes.

Yet, without meaning to, we do delay important matters. A little time goes by, and then suddenly it's been months and months. And yes, it is important to choose godparents, to settle on a time when family and friends can come to the baptism and to the party that goes with it. By the way, do invite them to the baptism rite itself, which is beautiful and moving.

A suggestion for parents-to-be: Before the baby's birth, attend the classes or meetings required for baptism. You'll be very busy once the baby gets here, and preparing for the baptism before the baby is born will help you avoid delay once he or she is here.
