


Please let your parishioners know:

December 12, 2010 Third Sunday of Advent

Is 35:1-6a, 10 • Jas 5:7-10 • Mt 11:2-11

When I was ten, my father died suddenly of a heart attack. Understandably, my mother—left alone to raise three adolescents—was devastated. At my father's funeral, she cried to her mother-in-law that she didn't know how to go on and raise us without her husband. My tough German grandmother, who had lost her own husband at age forty-five and raised five children on her own, looked my mother in the eye and said firmly, "You have no choice." Though the words rang harsh to my mother's ears, in the ensuing days and years she returned to those words again and again for motivation and the energy to move forward.

Now that I'm an adult, my grandmother's words strike me as prophetic in that they spoke truth—hard truth—and challenged my mother to a new way of life. They were words she held on to for hope and inspiration.

The readings today are particularly concerned with prophetic words. The prophet Isaiah provides a hopeful vision for the people of Judah, who were besieged by foreign armies. God's promises of future rejoicing, abundance, and healing—spoken through Isaiah—challenged the people to remain faithful to Yahweh. In the Gospel, Jesus praises John the Baptist despite John's challenging words and the reality that he wasn't the person his followers had expected to see.

Many times people speak prophetically to us—in words sometimes hopeful and sometimes challenging—but either way, they call us into a new way of life and, often, draw us closer to God. In this third week of Advent, as we rejoice with anticipation at the Lord's drawing near, take some time to thank God for the people who have spoken prophetic words you hold on to for hope and inspiration.
