# February 13, 2011 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sir 15:15–20 / 1 Cor 2:6–10 / Mt 5:17–37 or 5:20–22a, 27–28, 33–34a, 37

I can be particularly poor at the process of making choices. The choices themselves aren't bad—it's getting there that's the challenge. I try on an item of clothing multiple times before finally buying it. And don't give me a lengthy menu at a restaurant if you expect to eat any time soon—I'll spend half the night choosing between all the good options.

The readings today speak clearly of the wisdom needed to make choices. People I consider wise are able to discern which choices are important and which are not. They know what's significant in life and what's not. They know how to pick their battles. Wise people have learned that choices about clothing, dinner entrées, and even many political or theological issues aren't significant enough to warrant lengthy focus and attention. The important choices are those highlighted in today's reading from Sirach—the choices of life and death, of good and evil—how we live in fidelity to God's wisdom and call to us.

As the clearest revelation of God's wisdom, Jesus presents examples of the choices we face in living lives faithful to God. More is expected of us than simple obedience to the letter of the law. Not only should we not kill, but we also should choose not to harbor anger. Not only is adultery sinful, but lustful thoughts are just as problematic. Jesus calls us as disciples to do more than expected, more than the status quo.

Though challenging, these expectations call forth wisdom from us—to set aside the unimportant choices about which we spend so much time fretting and focus on the choice that really matters: the choice to follow the Lord.
