The spirit of the ford has been given to me, for he has anointed me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the ford's year of favour.

In the time of Jesus, there were two places of worship in Israel: the Temple and the synagogue. There was only one Temple; it was located in Jerusalem. But there were hundreds of synagogues; every village

The Temple was a place of sacrifice. There Jews offered to God such things as lambs and doves. The synagogue was a place of instruction. There Jews listened to God's Word and tried to apply it to their lives.

As you'd expect, the synagogue service and the temple service have their counterparts in our Mass. The first half of the Mass is like the synagogue service. It's called the Liturgy of the Word and deals with reading Scripture and applying it to our lives – just as Jesus did for the people of Nazareth in today's gospel. The last half of the Mass is like the temple service. It's called the Liturgy of the Eucharist and deals with offering sacrifice - just as Jesus did at the Last Supper.
