July 24, 2011 SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1 Kgs 3:5, 7-12 / Rom 8:28-30 / Mt 13:44-52 or 13:44-46

You know you're turning into your parents when you start talking like them. The phrase of my mother's I've recently started spouting is, "My time is worth something!" She tends to use that phrase after shopping extensively for the best price among several stores, then realizing that the five dollars she'll save isn't worth it. I use that phrase when contemplating a project that would provide extra spending money but ultimately would require too much time away from my family.

Learning the value of time seems to be a gift of growing older and growing in wisdom.

Today's Scriptures ask us to consider what we value most. 1 Kings describes Solomon's request for a wise and understanding heart to lead God's people. He doesn't ask for less valuable gifts, such as riches or an enemy's death, and his choice immensely pleases God. In the Gospel, Jesus again reflects in parables about the value of the kingdom of heaven. He compares the reign of God to an extraordinarily rare pearl a merchant buys with all his savings because he knows its true value.

If someone asked what is most valuable to us, we would quickly name our family, friends, and God. But do the choices we make every day truly reflect what we hold dear? Or does making money or a name for ourselves at work trump time spent with our children? Do we play online games or get lost in TV when we could extend a hand to a struggling friend? Are we willing to put God—and bringing about God's kingdom—at the center of our days rather than just at church on Sunday?

It may be time to reevaluate how to better treasure the pearls of great price in our lives.

July 31, 2011 EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Is 55:1-3 / Rom 8:35, 37-39 / Mt 14:13-21

I love free samples—perhaps a little too much. You'll find me happily munching away at the grocery store sample tables, wondering if I'd get another sample if I came back wearing sunglasses or a hat. My friends tease about my ability to make a whole meal from the samples at a big discount store on a Saturday afternoon. I can't help it—I love free food!

Perhaps that's why today's Scriptures appeal to me so. Isaiah voices God's free offer of water, grain, wine, and milk to the hungry and thirsty. Jesus miraculously feeds over five thousand people, who pay nothing for the meal. These sound like the ultimate free samples.

As we know, the free samples at grocery stores are teasers intended to leave us wanting more and lead to the purchase of some item we can't live without. But God's free samples aren't limited to a tiny cup of juice or a minuscule bite of pizza. The nourishment God offers isn't a teaser that leaves us hungry—it's an all-you-caneat, life-giving feast. Isaiah declares that God provides free food to draw us into deeper relationship, "to renew with you the everlasting covenant." We're not asked to buy something, but to listen to and heed God's Word, which leads to life.

So too, in the Gospel, Jesus insists there is "no need for them to go away," though he came to a deserted place to be alone. He welcomes the burgeoning crowd into a deeper relationship through listening to and being fed by him.

God is constantly welcoming us into a deeper relationship of trust, commitment, and love. It's up to us to step up to God's free-sample table, listen to God's Word, and discover the abundance of God's gifts for us.
