The National debate on assisted dying has highlighted several points that need addressing. Though our Christian faith prevents us from taking our own life or the life of another by deliberate means, our Christian faith does encourage us to choose wisely those treatments and procedures that we are willing to undergo. No one should feel forced to accept a treatment or procedure that is invasive, onerous or even harmful to their health.

⇒ Though water and food should never be deliberately withheld, there may come a

time when the person is not able to consume them naturally or the body no longer desires it. Far from deliberately starving themselves to death, the body has entered the natural process of dying. Methods of hydration, using an IV drip, should not be withheld. Extraordinary methods of feeding, on the other hand, are deemed invasive and can be accepted or rejected depending on the circumstance.

⇒ Treatments and procedures must also be judged on the likelihood of their success, their possible side effects and complications, the seriousness of the intervention and the intended result. While the taking of medication is accepted as a normal way of dealing with medical conditions, the benefits must always outweigh the side effects. No one is obligated to endure a treatment that produces undue suffering, even if it prevents them from dying.

⇒ Certain drugs and painkillers are known to hasten death. Even so, they can still be used as long as this side effect is not the intended purpose. Palliative Care, the control of pain and suffering, especially during the dying process, is paramount in helping our loved ones in their time of need. Palliative care also includes the physical, spiritual, social and psychological care of each person in the context of a loving environment where Christ is present in the care and concern of family, visitors, and health care providers. Christians should do everything possible to promote, fund and assist palliative care in their community. Our local Hospice group is an important part of the movement, and so we are. –Rev. Fr. Bart van Roijen, Vocations Director, Diocese of Nelson, B.C.
