REFLECTION for today: ⇒ As Catholics, we always make the sign of the cross when we pray and it's accompanied by the words, "In the name of the

Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit". This reminds us of our belief in the one God in three divine persons, the Trinity.

⇒ The mystery of the Holy Trinity is central to our faith. But this belief in the Trinity can be useless if this has nothing to do with our day-to-day life. We should find meaning and importance of our belief in the Trinity to our life. So, let us try to explore the life of the Trinity and let us find its significance to us and to our life.

⇒ First, in the Trinity, there is equality. The

Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are equal. There is no superior or inferior. The Trinity offers some hope for the human society. A society which is characterized by the inequality is not willed by God. Every society should conform itself to the community of God. If a Christian community is an image of God, then it should live and exercise equality. A community that lives in equality is a reflection of God as Trinity. ⇒ Second, in the Trinity, there is mutual indwelling. One of the Trinitarian teachings of the Church Fathers is the "perichoresis". In simple terms, it means that one person is seen in the other because one lives in the other. The Father is in the Son and the Son is in the Father. We can apply this to husband and wife relationships. Each time we witness a Catholic wedding, we always hear the gospel passage which says that "they are no longer two but one". Certainly, the oneness that is referred to here is the 'oneness of mind and heart". But this could

only happen when a husband has already

entered into the world of the wife, and vice versa. Of course, this does not happen overnight. This takes a process, and in fact, a long process. Knowing and understanding a spouse take a long process. In the same way, dwelling or living with a spouse is a process that one must undergo.

⇒ Third, the Trinity is a communion of love. St John says that God is love. And we know how the Father loves the Son, and how the Son loves the Father. But it was St Augustine who said that what binds the Father and Son is the Holy Spirit, because the Holy Spirit is the Spirit of love. As a community of love, the Holy Trinity has a concern for humanity. The Trinitarian offer of salvation is an indication of their love for us. The creation is a great act of God's love. The offering of Christ on the cross is also a noble act of God's love for us. The work of sanctification by the Holy Spirit is also indicative of God's continuing expression of his love for us.

⇒ In total, the Trinity is a community characterized by equality, mutual indwelling and love. Christian communities should be equal, participative, and loving. Thus, our belief in the Trinity is not useless because the Trinitarian relationship offers hope to us. If we find our families struggling in life and relationship with one another, then let us turn to the Holy Trinity because the Holy Trinity offers us some solutions. In this manner, our belief in the Trinity cannot be considered as something "high" and useless. Indeed, the life of the Trinity has something to do with our life, and with our day-to-day life.
