Giving Without Counting the Cost

The Hebrew almana (widow) refers to a married woman whose husband has died, and who has remained unmarried. In the New Testament the word used is the Greek chera.

Other terms associated with "widow" in the Bible shed light on both her personal experience and her social plight. Weeping, mourning, and desolation describe her personal experience after the loss of her spouse. Poverty and indebtedness describe her financial situation. With no one to stand for her legal rights, as in the case of a widow left with small children, the widow is in an extremely vulnerable economic situation. Hence, she is frequently placed alongside orphans and the landless immigrants, representatives of the poorest of the poor.

Legislation provides some social security for the widow. She is permitted to glean the fields and the vineyards during the harvest. Tithes are shared with her. Provision is to be made for her at the main religious feasts. The measure by which a ruler in Israel is to be judged as good is whether the powerless ones like the widows are cared for.

The widow – whose value is found in her "being" and not in "doing" - has God, above all, as her protector and benefactor. God manifests his special care for the powerless. No wonder, during his ministry, Jesus who comes to reveal the Father, exemplifies a special care and compassion for widows.
