ANNUAL APPEAL BULLETIN REFLECTION:

"If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." (Luke 17:6)

Most of us are aware that a mustard seed is incredibly small; in fact, it was one of the smallest seeds known in the world. The mulberry tree, on the other hand, was known to have a vast and large network of roots which spread far out from the trunk of the tree.

Jesus' point is that faith cannot be measured by size or depth. It is as if He is saying that the key is quality, not quantity. It is not the size of one's faith, but its presence, and the willingness of each person to rely on that faith in trying times.

One of the most important facets of a disciple's life is trust in God. It is that trust, a trust built on faith, which gives us the strength to follow lives of responsibility and service. What Jesus is saying at the end of today's Gospel, "...we have done only what we ought to have done," is that service is a privilege – a gift of God's love and mercy, not a burden.
