Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Hb 1:2-3; 2:2-4 • 2 Tm 1:6-8, 13-14 • Lk 17:5-10

I met my mother-in-law in a bar. I'd been dating her daughter for a few months. The two of them came into the place where I was singing. That night I learned a great deal about both of them. They were mother and daughter, but good friends also. They traveled together, laughed together, and watched old movies and cried together.

A friend of mine, a keen student of human nature whose pastoral duties involve witnessing a lot of weddings often says, "You fall in love with a person, but you marry a whole family." I was blessed to have found a second mother.

It was devastating for all of us when she was diagnosed with Alzheimer's. In the last years of her life, her mind faded more dimly and our hearts widened more deeply with tough emotions and poignant questions.

The prophet Habakkuk sums up what we feel when we hit an emotional brick wall: "How long, O LORD? I cry for help but you do not listen! I cry out to you, 'Violence!' but you do not intervene." Do we dare talk to God like that? The closer we are to someone, the more honest we can be. The prophet talks in strong language. We understand what he means.

God doesn't offer simple answers. God asks us to look at the whole picture. In the good as with the bad, God stands with us. The message of Christ's cross is that God stands with us no matter what. God redeems our lives, whatever twists they take.

And so Habakkuk offers us also not answers, but a strategy: "I will stand at my guard post, and station myself upon the rampart, And keep watch to see what he will say to me...For the vision still has its time."

Bill C-300 Update

Urge your MP to vote for Bill C-300 this Fall!

Bill C-300, also known as the "responsible mining bill," is an important piece of legislation that will be coming up for another vote in the House of Commons as soon as October 27th, 2010. The third reading of this Bill was held on September 20th, during which several MPs spoke in support of the Bill, although some still oppose it. On October 26th, the Bill will have a second hour of debate for its third reading, which will then be followed by a vote shortly thereafter. In 2009, the Bill just narrowly passed its second reading by a vote of 137-133. That vote was won by reaching out to MPs and reminding them that Canadians are committed to justice and sustainability, and we expect our companies to behave responsibly.


DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE is asking you to urgently contact your MP and urge him/her to vote for Bill C-300 when it comes up for vote this Fall.

Bill C-300 is a private member's bill that was introduced to Parliament on February 9, 2009 by Liberal MP John McKay. The Bill proposes to implement a number of key recommendations from the March 2007 Final Report of the National Roundtables on Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Roundtables. The recommendations reflected the consensus of representatives from industry and a civil society coalition in which DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE participated. In 2008-2009, DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE's campaign on mining gathered thousands of signatures, calling on the government of Canada to implement the recommendations, including the appointment of an independent ombudsperson to investigate allegations of corporate misbehavior.

If passed, Bill C-300 will:

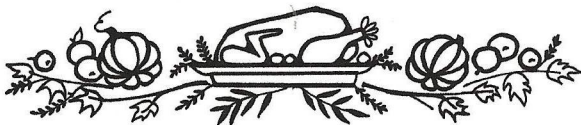
- put in place human rights, labour, and environmental standards that Canadian extractive companies receiving government support must live up to when they operate in developing countries
- create a complaints mechanism that will allow members of affected communities abroad, or Canadians, to file complaints against companies that are not living up to those standards;
- create a possible sanction for companies that are found to be out of compliance with the standards, in the form of loss of government financial and political support.
