

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Is 45:1, 4-6 / 1 Thes 1:1-5b / Mt 22:15-21

"Captains, pick your teams!"

Those words spoken by well-meaning PE teachers probably still strike fear in the hearts of many adults. Whether the game was kickball, dodgeball, or Red Rover, choosing teams inevitably meant someone would have the unenviable position of last one chosen. Often it was the child who didn't excel at sports or who ranked low on the popularity scale. It's a universal truth—no one wants to be chosen last.

The theme of being chosen is evident in today's first two readings, but there's no need to feel dread about this selection process. This isn't a contest based on athleticism or popularity—it's God doing the choosing. And when God chooses, each person is specially chosen for the team.

The prophet Isaiah claims, "I have called you by your name, giving you a title." Saint Paul reminds the Thessalonians how much God loves them and that they are, therefore, chosen. God chose each of us to have a unique and precious relationship with him. There was nothing random about it.

But do we choose God? We might quickly say, "Of course!" But think again. God speaks through Isaiah, "I am the LORD, there is no other." Jesus challenges us to give to God what is his. Do we choose to actively engage in our relationship with God, or does it fall to the wayside in lieu of other priorities? Do we seek God in good times just to deepen our relationship, or do we seek him only when we're in need? Do we truly give God the time and attention he deserves?

We've already made it onto God's kickball team now it's up to us to choose him in return.
