ANNUAL APPEAL BULLETIN REFLECTION:

In Jesus' Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector, the Pharisee exhibits all the good and respectable qualities. The Tax Collector is just the opposite, both a traitor of his people and a greedy cheat who takes more than his due. But God accepts the prayer of the Tax Collector and not the Pharisee's. Why? Because the Pharisee is busy praising his own goodness and is concerned only about his opinion of himself. The Tax Collector, knowing what sort of person he is, asks God for mercy and forgiveness.

In the reading from 2 Timothy, St. Paul also mentions some of his sufferings and declares, "I have kept the faith." But it's clear that he knows that it's only through the strength of God that provided that he was able to do this, not his own strength.

Of course, we're called to reject sin, but these readings can remind us that Jesus died to make us holy, not respectable, and he taught, "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Our discipleship of the Lord, like sharing our resources with the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal, is a grateful response to God's generosity to us, not an attempt to impress others – or ourselves.
