



# Good News!

## September 25, 2011 TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Ez 18:25-28 / Phil 2:1-11 or 2:1-5 / Mt 21:28-32

Anyone who has played a sport involving a ball knows the importance of follow-through. Coaches repeat this lesson to their players: Stopping your leg when it touches the soccer ball won't result in a long kick. Swinging a bat partway around won't carry the ball far. To score the goal or hit the home run, you have to follow through with your leg or bat.

Today's Gospel is all about follow-through. A father asks his sons to work in the vineyard. One son says "Heck, no!" but then does the work. The other son says, "Sure, dad!" but doesn't get off the couch. One son follows through; the other doesn't.

Sometimes we say an enthusiastic yes to God on Sundays, but that yes lacks follow-through after we leave church. Do we share the Sign of Peace with fellow parishioners but nearly run them over in the parking lot after Mass? Do we sing "Holy, Holy," but on Monday gossip about our coworkers? Do we come to the eucharistic table where people of all races and genders are welcome, but then on Wednesday exclude one of them?

Our follow-through is always incomplete, but that's why Christ—our model as well as our savior—died for us. That's why we should keep trying to follow through. As Saint Paul reminds us, Jesus is God's yes to us—he emptied himself and became human, showing us how to live with faithfulness to God, even to death.

In other words, he followed through.
